Additional Comments:

Question 1: I co-sponsored a bill to provide this type of scholarship grant as a freshman and voted for the current Opportunity Scholarship program. Government grants to attend preschool and college are granted to the child regardless of school attended. Why educational money should not be given to the school operator who then tells the child which school must be attended. This is an issue of parental school choice of which I am a strong proponent.

Question 4: Incentives have become commonplace. Texas has no income taxes yet has an incentive budget three times that of NC. The NC program which I supported as a Senior Finance Chair pays incentives as a percentage of the taxes paid by the new employees after the taxes are collected up to a maximum grant. There is no case in which companies who do not perform will receive any incentive payments.

Question 5: North Carolina did not have a separate nondiscrimination statute while I was in the House; we relied on the Federal Statutes. The Supreme Court has now made this question moot.

Question 9: Once the child has draw a breath there can be no ambiguity that a citizen of North Carolina with all the rights and protections is the object of this conversation. The child is entitled to the same level of care that would be granted to any other citizen of North Carolina.

Question 13: The decisions made by every person will be influenced by their deeply held beliefs. The people of faith are no different from any one else and should not be treated differently.
