Explanation to 13

Should a person's religious beliefs influence the decisions they make while serving in public office? The term "religious beliefs" is extremely broad considering there are thousands of religions in existence.

I assume this question is really asking "should Christians be influcenced by their religous beliefs when it comes to making policy decisions as a public offical?"?

Generally speaking, yes, I think Christians should carry their moral guidance into public service. For me, specifically, I happen to be a Christian, and I believe that God called me to public office. This does not mean I use the Bible as the only source when it comes to proposing or supporting policy positions. For example, I can argue the pro life position with or without the Bible. I can argue for school choice without the Bible. I can argue for policies that favor work over welfare with or without the Bible and so on and so forth. Having a strong foundation in faith in God is a good thing for anyone, especially those serving in public office. The Bible says "Blessed is the Nation whose God is the Lord"
