I'm not asking anyone to vote for me. I don't campaign, accept donations, or do questionnaires/forums/interviews/pledges. I don't even tell anyone I'm on the ballot. I am, as my committee name puts it, Just Buying Permission to Vote for Myself. Otherwise the Board of Rigged Elections would censor me, per Statute 163-123, NC's general ban on write-in voting.
