Question 5. Congress should not legalize marijuana for any application and rather, it should push the issue to the states for their voters to determine legality. A clear and present danger to the structure of our country is the incongruence of state and federal law caused by rouge and irresponsible states acting in direct violation of federal law. We have a clear process to change federal law; the states should observe it.

Question 13. Term limits as they are currently conceived will inadvertently increase the power of the "deep state" and entrenched bureaucracy to the detriment of the American people. Term limits are widely popular because they are an attempt to resolve legitimate issues of corruption, undue influence, and irresponsible spending. A better approach to solving these problems is establishing a mandatory retirement age for elected representatives, requiring elected officials to place their investments and holdings into blind trust, and instituting campaign finance reform.
